And we begin this New Year under the patronage of the Holy Mother of God, as we celebrate her Feast this weekend of 31st/1st. As we celebrate Mass today, let us rejoice in having Our Lady as a model of faith and discipleship, asking for her prayers, that her Son might give us the gifts of humility and grace, and the spiritual strength which she herself showed in welcoming her Son into her life, her family, and the world. How long does Christmas last? An octave? Twelve days? We can celebrate Christmas right up to February 2nd, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. So let us do so, stopping off at the Epiphany next week to celebrate the visit of the Maji to the Christ child.

Talking of the Twelve Day of Christmas; someone the other day was asking what the song meant, and I did remember reading an article about the spiritual significance of the song, which is as follows: The Partridge in the Pear Tree is Jesus

Christ. The 2 Turtle Doves are The Old and New Testaments. The 3 French hens are Faith, Hope and Charity, the theological virtues. The 4 Calling Birds are the four gospels and the four evangelists. The 5 Golden Rings are the first five books of the Old Testament, the Pentateuch. The 6 Geese A-laying are the six days of creation. The 7 Swans A-swimming are the gifts of the Holy Spirit, the seven sacraments. The 8 Maids-a-Milking are the Beatitudes. The 9 Ladies Dancing are the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit. The 10 Lords A-leaping are the ten commandments. The 11 Pipers Piping are the eleven faithful apostles. The 12 Drummers Drumming are the twelve points of doctrine in the Apostle's Creed. So there you go. Maybe something to think about when we next sing that song?
