SVP SUDAN APPEAL

Sudan has suffered a long history of conflict that has left behind a trail of destruction of unimaginable proportions together with untold human misery. **TODAY**, Deacon Michael will appeal for help in Sudan, particularly asking you to give life & hope in the Baby Feeding Project (it costs less than £1 a day to feed a baby for one week). The SVP provides baby feeding and pre-school meals in the internally displaced people's camps. Medical Centres in the camps are staffed by volunteer doctors & nurses - they also work in the prisons, where women often find themselves locked up together with their babies. **Every gift, of whatever value, will help the SVP continue its life-saving work.**

If you wish to make a donation, there will be 2 SVP members in the porch after Mass to help you. If you prefer to donate cash, please hand your donations to either Deacon Michael or any member of the SVP. If donating by cheque, please make payable to **SVP TWINNAGE.**
