This week's readings: During this time of Advent, the Church invites us to focus on Jesus Christ our Redeemer. As we prepare to commemorate his birth we commit ourselves to opening our hearts and minds and renewing our hope.

1st Reading *Isaiah* **63:16-17**, **64:3-8** - God is the potter and we are the clay, moulded into life with tenderness and care so that God's plan is fulfilled.

2nd Reading 1 Corinthians 1:3-9 - Paul recognises and thanks God for the gifts of the Spirit that are present in the church in Corinth.

Gospel Mark 13:33-37 - Jesus Christ is the Good News. The hopes of the prophets are fulfilled in him.

Message from Fr. Peter: And a very Happy New Year, as we begin a new year in the life of the Church - Year 'B' in the Sunday Cycle of Readings which means when we start the Ordinary Sundays of the Year we will be reading St. Mark's Gospel. But before we get there we will have Christmastide and before that Advent, our 4 weeks (actually this year 3 weeks and half a day) to spiritually prepare for our celebrations of the first coming of Christ. Everyone acknowledges that the weeks leading up to Christmas, both inside and outside the Church are some of the busiest of all, and that's true. But Advent is a time when we are asked to take a little time out to remember what we are truly preparing for - a celebration of the birth of a baby in Bethlehem two thousand years ago, would grow up to change the world, and, individually, to change our lives. The Advent Readings in Church focus on the Old Testament Prophecies about the coming of Jesus, most particularly in the book of Isaiah. Do make some time for Christ in your Christmas preparations, and let's look forward to being able to properly celebrate His Birthday here at SJ's & SP's in 3 weeks' time. Or rather, 3 weeks and a half-day (and that half-day might be the extra time we all desperately need!) Lord Jesus Christ; Give good news to the poor. Bind up the brokenhearted. Comfort those who mourn. Give hope to those who despair. Bring peace to our communities still divided by race and class and politics. Let our cities, towns and villages all be places of joy and beauty, so that all might give praise to you, and always be found watching and praying, and waiting...
