1st Reading *Isaiah* **11:1-10** When the Messiah comes a new era of peace with justice shall dawn. Enemies will become friends and all will have knowledge of the Lord.

2nd Reading *Romans* **15:4-9** Members of the Christian community are to be friends to one another just as Christ has befriended us. This will give God glory and lead the nations to sing God's praise.

Gospel *Matthew 3:1-12* John the Baptist appears in the desert wearing simple clothes and eating only food that could be found in the wilderness. He is not interested in power or glory but in preparing hearts for the coming of the Lord.
