### LENT AT ST. JOSEPH'S AND ST. PETER'S

Stations of the Cross and Benediction: St. Peter's Every Mon evening at 7pm, St. Joseph's Every Tues evening at 7pm. Lent Sycamore Course: What do you Believe? All Welcome to further our Faith in this Holy Season. Every Wednesday in Lent at 7.00pm in St Peter's Parish Hall. The Holy Rosary Every Thursday 10.30am after Mass at St Joseph's 2nd Sunday in Lent - Just as Peter, James and John ascended the mountain and saw Jesus revealed in glory, in this Mass we open our eyes to the glory of Christ revealed in word and sacrament.

1st Reading Genesis 12:1-4 - God calls Abram to leave everything with which he is familiar – father, family and home – and go to a new country.

**2nd Reading 2** *Timothy* **1:8-10** – Paul calls us to reflect on the mystery of grace. We have not deserved anything God has given us - it has all been granted as a gift in Jesus Christ.

**Gospel Matthew 17:1-9** In the story of the Transfiguration, Peter, James and John have their vision of Jesus transformed as his glory is revealed.

**MESSAGE FROM FR. PETER:** Last Saturday, on the first weekend of Lent, Deacon-to-be-David and myself drove parishioners Nigel and Susan to Lancaster Cathedral for a service called the 'Rite of Election'. In this rather beautiful liturgy, people from around the diocese who are to be received into full communion with the Church at Easter, gather along with their sponsors and Parish Priests, to be presented to Bishop Paul, and formally declared 'the elect'. First of all the Catechumens, those who are to be baptised, are called by name and presented to the Bishop, who says a prayer over them, followed by the calling of the Candidates, those who have already received Christian Baptism, including our own Susan and Nigel. The Bishop welcomed them with the prayer: Lord God, you created the human race and are the author of renewal. Bless all your adopted children, and add these chosen ones to the harvest of your new covenant. As true children of the promise, may they rejoice in eternal life, won, not by the power of nature, but through the mystery of grace. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen. So let us look forward to the Easter Vigil when Nigel and Susan will be received into the Church, and let us pray for them as they make their final preparations for this wonderful step in their journey of faith. In other news, a woman came to the priest complaining about her husband's snoring. 'Is it a problem ?' asked the priest. 'yes', she replied, 'It stops me from hearing your sermons'. I'll get my coat....( and Brian the Organist can get his, as he shared this with me ! Cheers.)

The Stations of the Cross: This week we will pray a set of Stations of the Cross based around passages from the Old Testament Book of Isaiah. The Prophet Isaiah wrote about the coming Messiah in a way that was completely new in the Old Testament, that of a God who would come to this earth and achieve glory, not through worldly state or political triumph, but through suffering, and giving his life up as a servant for all. This theme of the 'Suffering Servant' runs right the way through the prayers, which begin with a quote from the Book of Isaiah, before asking us to contemplate on how we have and continue to play our part in this suffering, and how we can alleviate it for our brothers and sisters. Monday 7.00pm at St Peter's, Tuesday 7pm at St Joseph's.

Lectio Divina: Everyone is welcome to some discussion, prayer and meditation on the Sunday Scripture readings in the Hall at St Joseph's at 10.00am on Wednesdays. Another great way to celebrate this season of Lent, perhaps ?

Lent Sycamore Course; What do you believe? Sycamore is an informal course about the Christian faith, for people with some Christian background, who wish to renew their faith in the Season of Lent. The focus of these sessions is on knowing God and the salvation He offers in Jesus Christ and on our response to this offer of salvation in faith, freedom and love. Each session involves a short film and time for discussion. All are welcome. This Wednesday 8th March 7pm at St. Peter's Parish Hall, Lytham.
