ST. DOMINIC SAVIO - 9th March

Born at Riva, Italy, in 1842, St. Dominic Savio was only fifteen when he died but he had already attained a high degree of sanctity. A pupil of the great St. John Bosco who loved him like a son, St. Dominic organised the Company of the Immaculate Conception to help St. John in running the Oratory. Though St. Dominic's life was one of poverty, work, and suffering, it was filled with the cheerfulness and joy of sanctity. This model saint for modern youth once wrote to a friend: "Here we make sanctity consist in being joyful all the time and in faithfully performing our duties."

THE MONTH OF MARCH IS DEDICATED TO SAINT JOSEPH -

We don't know much about him except what is mentioned in the Gospels. Joseph was the husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the foster-father of Jesus. Holy Scripture proclaims him as a "just man", and the church has turned to Joseph for his patronage and protection. St Joseph is invoked as patron for many causes. He is the patron of the Universal Church. He is the patron of the dying because Jesus and Mary were at his death-bed. He is also the patron of fathers, of carpenters, and of social justice. Many religious orders and communities are placed under his patronage.
