Racial Justice Sunday should encourage proactive discussions on overt and covert forms of racism experiences by fellow Catholics from the travelling communities and to support the Church in its work with travellers.

SERVANT OF GOD ELIZABETH PROUT

The Sisters of the Cross and Passion have been a part of our parish, apart from a period from 1878 until 1896, since their arrival in 1873. They remained in St Peter's school from 1896 until the new school was built in 1960. The Sisters have always been happy to help in the life of the parish, with instruction in the faith, visiting the sick and needy in their homes very much at the heart of their work as they continued the mission of their Foundress Mother Mary Joseph of Jesus (Elizabeth Prout). She was a practical person; entirely God-centred; forgetful of self; generous in giving herself to others: willing to suffer in union with Our Lord's Passion so that God's Will might be done; and charitable in protecting the reputations of even her enemies, even at great loss to her own. We should pray to her with confidence and seek to imitate her example. Her mother became a Catholic and her father returned to his Catholic Faith. She is a great source of inspiration to us all. You can read more about her life in the definitive biography, Elizabeth Prout, 1820-1864. A Religious Life for Industrial England, by Dr Edna Hamer (Sr Dominic Savio CP) published by Gracewing.
