This Week's Readings: The world often chooses to live in the darkness of sin and injustice. Jesus Christ came to give us truth and light, and to share God's life with us.

1st Reading 2 *Chronicles* **36:14-16, 19-23 -** The rebuilding of the Temple and return of the exiles is a foretaste of the coming of Christ in the flesh, the visible presence of God in the world.

2nd Reading *Ephesians 2:4-10 -* We are God's work of art. Although we are marred by sin, Christ has come to restore the image of God in us, and raise us up to everlasting life.

Gospel: *John* **3:14-21** - Christ is the light of the world, offered to all. Through his incarnation he dispels the darkness of evil and shows us the way to the Father.

Message from Deacon David: This week's Lenten talk was all about Mary. We talked about Mary as a young girl growing up in First Century Nazareth, about how she was foreshadowed in the Old Testament for example in Isaiah, being the 'Virgin Mother of Emmanuel'. Her role in the New Testament and her relationship with her son Jesus, how she said "Yes" at the Annunciation, how she began her role as an intercessor on people's behalf at the wedding at Cana, informing Jesus that the wine had run out. After Jesus' first miracle, Mary appears to disappear quietly into the background until she appears at the foot of the cross. Here she courageously stands, silently consenting to His Sacrifice in her heart. It is here at the cross, Jesus and Mary would fulfil their respective destinies as the New Adam and New Eve, Redeemer and Woman. We delved into the 4 Dogmas of the Church relating to Mary: Mary as the Mother of God, The Immaculate Conception, The Perpetual Virginity of Mary and the Assumption of Mary. We prayed the oldest and most ancient prayer asking for Mary's intercession. The prayer, "Sub tuum praesidium" dates back to the 3rd century. There was so much more we could have talked about, Mary is a remarkable woman, the most important woman of all time. Today is the 4th Sunday of Lent or Laetare Sunday, meaning rejoice and we also celebrate Mothering Sunday or Mother's Day. We remember all our mothers, living and deceased. So, on this Mother's Day, let us pray that most ancient prayer asking Mary's intercession: We fly to thy patronage, O holy Mother of God; despise not our petitions in our necessities but deliver us always from all dangers, O glorious and blessed Virgin.
