A thought for Easter: Jesus' words in today's Gospel: "I am going now to prepare a place for you", give us great consolation. Jesus is actually getting a place ready for us in heaven! And then He is going to come back and take us with Him. The apostles are confused because they don't know where He is going and don't know the way. "I am the way, the truth and the life", says Jesus. This tells us that Jesus is not just going on ahead of us, He is also with us. The Father and the Son send the Holy Spirit to be with us, to dwell in us so that the blessed Trinity now dwells in us. The Lord wants to walk in our shoes, see through our eyes, and speak through our mouths. He must be our guide, our teacher, and our source of strength — our way, our truth and our life. And He wills that we may do 'greater things' than He did when He walked the earth, not because we are greater but because it is He who is working in us; and wants the effects of His work to be manifest through His Church. We just have to believe Him, trust Him, and keep the door open for Him; and then He will lead us to that place He has prepared for us.

From a Message from the Bishops: "...None of us knows, as yet, how or when the lockdown will end. There is likely to be a phased return to travelling and gathering. As a church, we are now planning for this time and our discussions with the statutory public health agencies and Government representatives are ongoing. Together with Catholics across England and Wales we desire the opening of our churches and access to the sacraments. Until then, we are continuing to pray and prepare...

On that first Easter day, the disciples were in lockdown and the doors were closed. In their isolation the Lord Jesus came among them and said 'Peace be with you.' May the peace of the risen Lord reign in our hearts and homes as we look forward to the day when we can enter church again and gather around the altar to offer together the Sacrifice of Praise." How to make an Act of Perfect Contrition

Perfect Contrition is a grace from God, so sincerely ask for this gift throughout the day prior to making your act of contrition: "My God, grant me perfect contrition for all my sins".

- 1. In reality or imagination kneel at the foot of a crucifix and say to yourself: "Jesus, my God and my Saviour, in the midst of your agony, you remembered me, you suffered for me, you wished to wipe away my sins".
- 2. Contrition is 'perfect' if you repent of your sins because you love God and are sorry for offending Him and causing the sufferings of Christ on the cross. Before the Crucified Christ remember your sins, repent of them because they have brought our Lord to His sufferings on the Cross. Promise him, that with His help, you will not sin again.
- 3. Recite, slowly and sincerely, an act of contrition focused on the goodness of God and your love of Jesus: "O my God, because you are so good, I am very sorry that I have sinned against you and by the help of your grace I will not sin again. Amen".
- 4. Make a firm resolution to go to sacramental confession as soon as practically possible.

How to make a Spiritual Communion

Desire, with earnest longing, to receive our Lord present — Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity — in the Blessed Sacrament. Say this prayer of St. Alphonsus de' Ligouri:

"My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Blessed Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire You in my soul. Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. As though You are already there, I embrace You and unite myself wholly to You; do not let me ever be separated from You. Amen".
