**THIS WEEK'S READINGS:** Christ promises to be with us whenever we meet in his name. Conscious of his presence among us here in this place, we offer God our thanks and our praise.

**1st Reading Ezekiel 33:7-9** - Like a guard keeping watch over a city, the prophet speaks the truth to avert disaster for the people.

**2nd Reading** *Romans* **13:8-10 -** Love is a "mutual debt" - an ongoing duty of care to one another.

**Gospel Matthew 18:15-20 -** It is through our unity - our communion with each other - that Christ is present among us.

MESSAGE FROM FATHER PETER: This week, on Friday 15th, we celebrate the memorial of Mary, Our Lady of Sorrows. Coming the day after the Feast of the Triumph of the Holy Cross of Christ on the 14th, we might think we are looking below the cross to Mary, standing supportively watching as her Son takes his final breath and offers up his Spirit. But traditionally this feast refers to the 'Seven Sorrows' of Mary (often referred to in French as 'sept doleurs' or in Franglais as the 'seven dolours'), a devotion which dates right back to the twelfth century. As the prophet Simeon prophesied that a sword would pierce Mary's heart, this devotion reminds us of the unique sorrows that Mary suffered as she journeyed with her Son. Seven Hail Mary's can be prayed whilst meditating on each of the sorrows which, mostly following the Scriptures, are: The Prophecy of Simeon in Luke 2; The Flight into Egypt in Matthew 2; The Loss of the Child Jesus in the Temple of Jerusalem, when Jesus was twelve years old in Luke 2; Mary meeting Jesus on the Via Dolorosa, the Fourth station of the Cross which is not found in Bible; The Crucifixion of Jesus in Matthew 27, Mark 15, Luke 23, and especially John 19; Jesus' Descent from the Cross in Matthew 27, Mark 15, Luke 23, and John 19; and finally the burial of Jesus in the tomb, also in Matthew 27, Mark 15, Luke 23, and John 19. Let intercession be made for us, we beseech You, O Lord Jesus Christ, now and at the Hour of our death, before the throne of Your mercy, by the Blessed Virgin Mary, Your Mother, whose most holy soul was pierced by a sword of sorrow in the hour of Your bitter Passion. Through You, O Jesus Christ, Saviour of the world, Who with the Father and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns world without end. Amen.
