'NO' TO ABORTION UP TO BIRTH -A SUCCESS!

ST. CAMMILLUS DE LELLIS, 14TH JULY

St. Camillus was born in 1550, in a small town of the Kingdom of Naples. In his youth he became a soldier and for some time led a wayward life. He lost so much in gaming that he was forced to work as a labourer on a building belonging to the Capuchins. Advice given to him by the guardian of the convent touched him and he resolved to change his conduct.

He now begged to be admitted into the Order, but Divine Providence willed otherwise. Twice he received the Capuchin habit but he was obliged each time to leave the novitiate on account of an ulcer on one of his legs. He later went to Rome and entered the Hospital of Incurables and after some time was appointed its administrator. Looking upon himself as the servant of the sick, he rendered them the most humiliating services.

Having been ordained a priest by the age of 32 he laid the foundation of the Congregation of Regular Clerics to administer to the sick. Henceforth his life was entirely devoted to the sick and dying and after his death this work was continued by the Order he had founded.

The saint had as confessor another saint, namely Philip Neri, the founder of the Oratory, who preceded him to the tomb. St. Camillus died on 14th July, 1614.

OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL - 16TH JULY

This is the patronal feast of the Carmelites. The Order of Carmelites takes its name from Mount Carmel, which was the first place dedicated to the Blessed Virgin and where a chapel was erected in her honour before her Assumption into heaven.

July 16th is also the feast of the "Scapular of Mount Carmel". On that day in 1251, the Blessed Virgin appeared to St. Simon Stock, General of the Carmelites at Cambridge, showed him the scapular and promised supernatural favours and her special protection to his Order and to all persons who would wear her scapular.

To obtain the indulgences and other benefits promised to those who wear the Carmelite scapular, a person must be invested by a priest who has the requisite faculties and must lead a consistent Christian life.
