As Christians, in times of difficulty we find it natural to turn to God as a flower grows towards the light. Unafraid and empowered to share the message of the Gospel, we now turn in our Eucharist to our loving Father in faith.

1st Reading 1 Kings 19:9, 11-13 - Running for his life, the prophet Elijah takes refuge in a cave where he encounters the presence of God.

2nd Reading *Romans* **9:1-5** - St Paul tells us about the sorrow and anguish he suffers because his fellow Jews refused to accept Christ as the Messiah.

Gospel Matthew 14:22-33 - While they are afraid, caught in high winds and rough seas, Jesus comes to the apostles. He calms their fears, and brings them peace.

THIS TUESDAY 15th is the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a HolyDay of Obligation. Masses are at SJ's Monday 7pm Vigil, SP's Tuesday 9am, SJ's Tuesday 10am.

Attendance at the Requiem at SJ's at 1pm also fulfils the HolyDay Obligation.

MESSAGE FROM FATHER PETER: This Tuesday we have our Midsummer HolyDay of Obligation, the beautiful Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. In many ways our Blessed Mother Mary holds our hands as we journey through the liturgical year. At the beginning of Advent we celebrate her Immaculate Conception, whilst, usually in the Middle of Lent, we celebrate the Annunciation on the twenty-fifth of March, nine months before Christmas. Christmas and Easter put Mary very much at the centre of the proceedings, in the house of Nazareth, in the Stable at Bethlehem, at the foot of the cross, and in the upper room when the Holy Spirit comes down on the Apostles on Pentecost Sunday. Until finally we celebrate this Tuesday's feast, which celebrates, as the Church tells us, the ending of Mary's life on earth, and her assumption into Heaven, body and soul. This Feast celebrates a life on earth lived solely in accordance to the will of God, and the honour and glory which was duly accorded such a life. As we praise and honour our Blessed Mother, let us also walk with her, following her Son, and His Father's will. *Almighty and everlasting God, Father in heaven, in the plan of your wisdom she who bore the Christ in her womb was raised body and soul in glory to be with him in heaven. May we follow her example in reflecting your holiness and join in her hymn of endless love and praise. Amen.*
