This Week's Readings: Just as the young Samuel and the first apostles were called, so are we. We are invited to become the body of Christ in the world, offering his message and presence to all we meet.

1st Reading 1 Samuel **3:3-10, 19 -** Samuel is called by the Lord and learns to respond so well that no word of the Lord falls to the ground.

2nd Reading 1 Corinthians 6:13-15, 17-20 - We are one in the spirit with the Lord because our bodies are the members that make up his body.

Gospel: John 1:35-42 - Jesus invites his first disciples to come and see where he lives. So they go and stay with him. Jesus renames Simon.

Message from Fr. Peter: The Sunday Reading Cycle for this liturgical year is 'B', which means that throughout 2024 we shall be reading the Gospel of St. Mark on Sundays. However, before we begin Mark, next week, we move towards the end of Christmastide with St. John's account of the calling of the first Apostles. For such a short Gospel reading there is actually a lot happening. Firstly, the first apostles were previously disciples of John the Baptist, who actively points them towards Jesus, the Messiah who they are looking for, and they stay with Jesus for the whole day. What wonderful catechesis from the mouth of Jesus himself as they start their great journey. It obviously is wonderful for them as, secondly, immediately they want to tell other people; John, who is writing this account, goes to tell his mate Andrew, who goes on to tell his brother Simon, who becomes Peter, 'Cephas', the rock on which the Church is to be built. There may be a lot of people in this world - in our own town - who are 'looking' for the Messiah, looking for fulfilment, and if we are to take on the mantle of apostles then it is up to us to point people to the Messiah, looking for sufficient. And perhaps we might look to the Apostle John and actually invite someone to meet Jesus in our Churches and in our liturgies. They may have just been waiting for an invitation to discover Jesus - they may just be waiting for us to say, 'come and see'. And let whoever comes into St. Joseph's and St. Peter's, for whatever reason, be assured of a great welcome. Perhaps, like the first Apostles, they may want to stay longer and learn a lot more, and begin their wonderful journey to becoming a member of God's family, and the family of St. Joseph's and St. Peter's.
