12.15pm Midday Office, live streamed from the chapel.

The sisters doing the presentations in the morning will also leave you some questions to think about. These questions will be taken up in an informal and optional discussion from 2.15pm - 3pm.

3.15pm - 4pm "Arise" ... talk by Sr. Mary Stella and she will leave you with some thoughts to take away with you at the end of the day.

At **4.30pm** each day, the sisters pray silently in chapel for all those affected by the Covid crisis. Those who wish are invited to join us for that time, which will be followed by Vespers, both live streamed from Chapel, closing our day together.
