St Joseph's Intention

A thought for Sunday: Although St John has quite a long account of what Jesus said at the Last Supper, he does not provide any account of Jesus' institution of the Eucharist there. What he does give us, that the other evangelists do not, is an exchange with the people after the feeding of the five thousand and Jesus' crossing over the water to the other side of the lake at Capernaum. Here the people ask Jesus for a sign as in Moses' time when the bread from heaven came down to feed his people. 'I am the bread of life', Jesus tells them. It is here that John presents the reality of what Jesus is saying. "Unless you <u>eat</u> the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life within you. Anyone who does <u>eat</u> my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life...' What we don't see from our translation is that Jesus uses two different words for 'eat'. These are given in the Greek: first, the word 'phagete' meaning simply to eat; then, 'trogon', which means to chew. Jesus is making the point that we must literally eat him in the Eucharist. This is no mere sign. Jesus is there: body, blood, soul and divinity. He not only gives himself for us on the cross, but also personally to us when we receive Him in Holy Communion. That's how far Jesus goes to show His love for us.

How to make an Act of Perfect Contrition

Perfect Contrition is a grace from God, so sincerely ask for this gift throughout the day prior to making your act of contrition: "My God, grant me perfect contrition for all my sins".

- 1. In reality or imagination kneel at the foot of a crucifix and say to yourself: "Jesus, my God and my Saviour, in the midst of your agony, you remembered me, you suffered for me, you wished to wipe away my sins".
- 2. Contrition is 'perfect' if you repent of your sins because you love God and are sorry for offending Him and causing the sufferings of Christ on the cross. Before the Crucified Christ remember your sins, repent of them because they have brought our Lord to His sufferings on the Cross. Promise him, that with His help, you will not sin again.
- 3. Recite, slowly and sincerely, an act of contrition focused on the goodness of God and your love of Jesus: "O my God, because you are so good, I am very sorry that I have sinned against you and by the help of your grace I will not sin again. Amen".
- 4. Make a firm resolution to go to sacramental confession as soon as practically possible.

How to make a Spiritual Communion

Desire, with earnest longing, to receive our Lord present — Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity — in the Blessed Sacrament. Say this prayer of St. Alphonsus de' Ligouri:

"My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Blessed Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire You in my soul. Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. As though You are already there, I embrace You and unite myself wholly to You; do not let me ever be separated from You. Amen".
