THIS WEEK'S READINGS: Today both the prophet Isaiah and Jesus use the comforting imagery of a banquet to describe the kingdom of heaven. We are all invited to this feast.

1st Reading Isaiah 25:6-10 - The messianic banquet.

2nd Reading *Philippians* **4:12-14. 19-20 -** St. Paul writes of his experiences and gives thanks to the people of Philippi. **Gospel** *Matthew* **22:1-14 -** The parable of the wedding feast. Many of the invited guests can't be bothered to turn up & the king ends up bringing in people from the street. The man who was not ready with a wedding garment is thrown out.

MESSAGE FROM FATHER PETER: October, of course, is the month of the Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the beautiful meditation on the life of Christ as seen through the eyes of our Blessed Mother. There is a tradition that in 1214, Our Lady appeared to St Dominic and gave him the Rosary, with it's Joyful, Sorrowful & Glorious mysteries, with the Luminous Mysteries (or 'Mysteries of Light') being added by John Paul II, who wanted the 3 year active ministry of Our Lord to be reflected in this great prayer.. 'One day,' St. Dominic said, 'through the Rosary... Our Lady will save the world.' In 1520, Pope Leo X officially approved the universal use of the rosary and in 1571, St. Pius V on the anniversary of the naval battle of Lepanto, the feast of the Holy Rosary was instituted, later made universal by Pope Clement XI, for October 7th. It was said that the Christians were victorious because of the help of the holy Mother of God invoked by the saying of the Rosary. In 1917 the Blessed Mother selected for herself the name 'Our Lady of the Rosary' at Fatima when she appeared to 3 children in Fatima saying, 'I want you to continue to say your rosary every day in honour of Our Lady of the Rosary to obtain the end of the war and peace in the world'. To encourage the celebration of the prayer, I've printed some leaflets, which are at the back of Church. Perhaps a Rosary for Peace in this world is more necessary than ever at this time, especially for the places in which Our Lady and her Son themselves would have walked. Loving and liberating Creator, through the intercession of Our Lady of the Rosary, send your healing Spirit upon all involved in the current conflict and violence in the Middle East. Comfort those who mourn or who have been harmed by brutality. Stand with those who are fearful. Protect & provide for the powerless & the vulnerable. Inspire a spirit of forbearance and understanding within all and uphold those who even now work for a just and durable peace. Through Christ Our Lord. Amen.

ST. PAUL OF THE CROSS, Priest

Thursday October 19th

St. Paul of the Cross was born at Ovada in the Republic of Genoa, 3rd Jan, 1694. His infancy and youth were spent in great innocence and piety. He was inspired from on high to found a congregation; in an ecstasy he beheld the habit which he and his companions were to wear, he reached the conclusion that God wished him to establish a congregation in honour of the Passion of Jesus Christ. On Nov 22nd, 1720, the Bishop vested him with the habit that had been shown to him in a vision, the same that the Passionists wear at the present time.

For 50 years St. Paul remained the indefatigable missionary of Italy. God lavished upon him the greatest gifts in the supernatural order, but he treated himself with the greatest rigor, and believed that he was a useless servant and a great sinner. His saintly death occurred at Rome in the year 1775, at the age of 81. He was canonized by Pope Pius IX in 1867.
