OUR OVERSEAS PINPRICK MISSION -LATEST

I was too late for last week's newsletter to SHOUT OUT that our Running Total for Our Overseas Mission shot through £150,000 on 7th February which is amazing in anybody's money. Thanks to your generosity The Parish of St Peter's has been able to help two of The Cross and Passion's (CP) PINPRICK Overseas Missions. The first was from 2006 to 2010 in **Tsabong** in the Kalahari Desert, Botswana run by Sister Therese O'Regan CP. We sent her a total of £48033 to build 15 of 45 small permanent shelters that CP built for abandoned families of AIDS victims, look after an orphanage for 80 children, buy ARV treatment, other medicines, food and clothing. After Tsabong was handed over in October 2010 to a local organisation, we were asked to support a unit run by Sister Maeve O'Driscoll CP that operated within their Mission in Villa El Salvador (VES), a shanty town in the sand dunes 20km south of Lima, Peru. To date, we have sent £100,187.51 to help look after destitute Taytaco's (Grannies and Granddads in local dialect) who have been abandoned by their families. Sister Maeve relies on our help to keep the unit open and to supply medicines, all sorts of medical care and equipment, a doctor and nurses for more hours a week, hot food, fresh running water, the list goes on. So troops, a zillion thanks and pats on the back to all for your support and for being so generous, it's been True Mission at work, a real team effort, it wouldn't work without you! A-M-A-Z-I-N-G. * (for the eagleeyed mathematician, the remainder is in the bank ready to send, 100% goes to PINPRICK)
