**Gospel John 20:19-31 -** The crescendo of John's Gospel - the gift of peace and the resurrection of the body.

**MESSAGE FROM FR. PETER.** We have been privileged this Easter Week to celebrate Father Frank's Requiem. I worked with Fr. Flynn for eighteen months when I was first ordained at St. Joseph's in Preston, and know how much he was loved in his Parishes. I've asked Deacon Michael to pen our Message this week:

MESSAGE FROM DEACON MICHAEL. This week we have said our farewells to Fr Frank, commended his soul to the merciful care of the Risen Lord, buried his mortal remains at Saltcotes and many of us will have left a comment in the Book of Condolence at St. Peter's. You have only to read through those comments to realise the strong bonds of friendship, love and respect which Fr Frank built up with his parishioners in his eighteen years as St. Peter's parish priest; bonds which changed lives. On a personal note, the example of his preaching and simple way of living were the catalysts which changed the direction of my life towards a calling to the Diaconate, something for which I shall always be thankful. You will also see from those comments just how many people record their thanks for Fr Frank's help in so many ways, the hallmark of a truly pastoral priest. He was also a man who brought about change - radically renovating the fabric of the church, bringing Saltcotes Chapel back into regular use, re-ordering the former school to provide a hall and office suite, and vacating the underused presbytery; these latter two moves providing vital rental streams which set the parish finances on sound foundations. He also changed our relationship with our fellow Christians in Lytham with his passion for ecumenism, established a functioning Parish Council, trained Catechists and led countless RCIA sessions..... I could go on, but space doesn't permit. In his final contribution to the parish newsletter when he retired, Fr Frank said 'St Peter's will be locked away in my memory until the day I die as being 'a little bit of heaven on earth'. Fr Frank, your memory will be treasured by the parishioners of St. Peter's until they die! " Well done, thou good and faithful servant" Matthew 25:23
