LENT AT ST. JOSEPH'S AND ST. PETER'S

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday 22nd February - Ashes will be blessed and distributed at all Masses.

St. Peter's 9am, St. Joseph's 12noon, St. Joseph's 7pm

Stations of the Cross and Benediction: St. Peter's Every Mon evening at 7pm, St. Joseph's Every Tues evening at 7pm. **Lent Sycamore Course:** What do you Believe? All Welcome to further our Faith in this Holy Season.

Every Wednesday of Lent (starting next Wednesday) at 7pm in St. Peter's Parish Hall.

7th Sunday in Ordinary Time - God's Spirit is here among us. Let us prepare ourselves to be touched and challenged by the love and generosity of that Holy Spirit.

1st Reading Leviticus 19:1-2. 17-18 - God calls for the people to embrace holiness, showing love and avoiding grudges.

2nd Reading 1 Corinthians 3:16-23 - St. Paul points out that God's wisdom is different from the thinking prevalent in the world. Every person should be regarded as a temple of the Holy Spirit.

Gospel Matthew 5:38-48 - Jesus tells his followers to take on the challenge of loving enemies as well as family and friends.

MESSAGE FROM FR. PETER: Every day during Covid, when the children were at home working online, via the school I would send them a prayer video. I had to be creative in filming the videos; as well as filming around the Church, I was also filmed at the barbers, in the dentist's chair, in Wynsor's World of Shoes (don't ask) and many other locations, including the Pizza Counter at Morrisons, at which I made this prayer (with curious looks from the shoppers and pizza maker): *God our Heavenly Father, the crust of the pizza goes round and round, like your everlasting love for us; the tomato base makes sure that every bite of pizza has tomato in it, reminding me that everything that I do today has to have You in it, helping me in every way; the many different toppings remind me that there are many different ways that I can show people your love; so help me be a pizza of love in the world today. Amen. Why am I telling you this? Because Lent begins on Wednesday, and I'll be giving up Pizza for Lent (harder than that might sound!). I'll also be doing an Origami Challenge, making a different paper creation every day, and seeking your sponsorship to raise money for SJ's Care and SP's SVP. There are lots of ways we can celebrate this joyful season (that's what the preface to the Eucharistic Prayer calls Lent), so let's together make the most of these 40 days of preparation for our great celebrations of the Resurrection (and a gargantuan Margarita on Holy Saturday night). In other news, on Ash Wednesday I've got a job delivering pizzas. You're not allowed to eat liver on Ash Wednesday. I'll get my coat...*

Ash Wednesday is a day of universal fast and abstinence. Fasting is obligatory for all who have completed their 18th year and have not yet reached their 60th year. Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal. 2 smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal. Abstinence (from meat) is obligatory for all who have reached their 14th year.

Lent Sycamore Course; What do you believe? Sycamore is an informal course about the Christian faith, for people with some Christian background, who wish to renew their faith in the Season of Lent. The focus of these sessions is on knowing God and the salvation He offers in Jesus Christ and on our response to this offer of salvation in faith, freedom and love. Each session involves a
