**4th Sunday in Lent:** Christ is the light of the world; let us pray that we may allow his light to shine in our hearts and minds, that we may finally share his glory.

**1st Reading Samuel 16:1, 6-7**: David is anointed king by the prophet Samuel. David will prophesy the coming of the true Messiah, Jesus

**2nd Reading Ephesians 5:8-14** Paul urges the Ephesians to walk in the light of Christ..

**Gospel John 9:1-41** Jesus heals a man blind from birth, who recognises Jesus as Lord and God.

**MESSAGE FROM FR. PETER:** Today is mid-lent Sunday! So how are we doing? Have you been to Stations? Taken an opportunity for the Sacrament of Reconciliation? Kept up with your Lenten fast? Well, if we are feeling a bit jaded with our Lenten observances, and if our Lenten acts of penitence and giving up things have completely gone by the board, if our acts of charity haven't quite been what they should be, and our extra prayer never materialised, then today is a chance to start again, because this is Laetare Sunday, or, as it used to be known in England 'Refreshment 'Sunday, a chance to pick ourselves up, refresh ourselves, and continue to prepare for the great celebrations of the Paschal mystery in a couple of weeks' time. It's only two weeks to Holy Week, so the whole timetable for those special days is overleaf.. Please make time in your diary to join us for our most especial services of the year. My Origami Challenge continues, and thanks to those who have donated paper and books to help me on my way. There are envelopes at the back of church if you'd like to sponsor me, with any contributions going to SJ's Care and SP's SVP – and if you would like a set of Origami napkins, just let me know. At this rate I'll soon have a black belt in Origami. Talking of which, *Dwayne Johnson is a master of Origami... **The Stations of the Cross:** This week our prayers are entitled, 'With Mary, a Mother'. They were written during the quiet Lents of Covid by Eileen MacCormac, the secretary at St Bernadette's in Bispham, who now also sorts out the office for me here at SJSP's every Thursday, with prayers added by myself. The Stations' title reflects their theme: not the prayers of a Saint of God, but a humble earthly mother, watching her Son being abused, tortured, and dying in agony, with nothing that she can do, other than that which she had done every moment from the Annunciation: love him, and be there for him, no matter her personal grief. These prayers really do lead us into the moment of which Simeon prophesied when Jesus was eight days old, that for Mary, 'a sword will pierce your own heart too' and take us to the foot of the Cross with our Blessed Mother. **Monday 7.00pm at St Peter's, Tuesday 7pm at St Joseph's.** 

**Easter Triduum:** Following the Bishop's instructions for our celebrations, and the liturgical norm of the Easter Triduum being one complete service, this year the Maundy Thursday and Holy Saturday Service will take place in one of our Churches. There are areas in the diocese now where up to six Churches only have one Triduum (including South Blackpool, where three churches have only one). This year the Triduum will take place at St Joseph's, with St Peter's hosting the Triduum next year. Due to the numbers involved, I have been advised to have a Good Friday Service in both churches, as well as Stations of the Cross in both churches on Good Friday. Members of both churches are invited to take part in all services, with readers and singers all invited. If anyone needs transport from St Peter's to St Joseph's this will be organised nearer the time. Many thanks for your support and understanding. The full timetable is overleaf.
