STS. JOHN FISHER, Bishop, & THOMAS MORE, MARTYRS

June 22nd

ST. JOHN FISHER was born in Beverley, Yorkshire, in 1459, and educated at Cambridge, from which he received his Master of Arts degree in 1491. In 1497 he was appointed confessor to Lady Margaret Beaufort, mother of Henry VII. In 1504, he became Bishop of Rochester and Chancellor of Cambridge, in which capacity he also tutored Prince Henry who was to become Henry VIII. In 1527, this humble servant of God actively opposed the King's divorce proceedings against Catherine, his wife in the sight of God. Unlike the other Bishops of the realm, St. John refused to take the oath of succession which acknowledged the issue of Henry and Anne as the legitimate heir to the throne and he was imprisoned in the Tower in April 1534. Henry retaliated by having him beheaded within a month.

ST. THOMAS MORE was born in London in 1478. After a thorough grounding in religion and the classics, he entered Oxford to study law. He attracted the attention of Henry VIII and was made Lord Chancellor, however, he resigned when Henry persisted in holding his own opinions regarding marriage and the supremacy of the Pope. He was confined to the Tower and 15 months later was tried and convicted of treason. He was beheaded on 6th July, 1535.
