Tuesday 21st September Feast of St Matthew

St Matthew - one of the Apostles - is the author of the first Gospel. He was the son of Alpheus. Whilst sitting at the "receipt of custom" in Capernaum, he was called to follow Jesus. As a tax collector, he would have been literate in Aramaic and Greek. His fellow Jews would have despised him for what was seen as collaborating with the Roman occupation force.

After his call, Matthew invited Jesus home for a feast. On seeing this, the Scribes and the Pharisees criticized Jesus for eating with tax collectors and sinners. This prompted Jesus to answer -

"I came not to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance."

Thursday 23rd September *St Pius of Pietrelcina*

Padre Pio, also known as Saint Pio of Pietrelcina, was an Italian friar, priest, stigmatist and mystic of the Order of Friars Minor Capuchin. Pio is revered for having borne stigmata: permanent wounds on his hands and feet like those Christ suffered at the crucifixion. He lived for decades with these wounds which never healed but never became infected. Pio was credited with thousands of miraculous cures during his lifetime, and is still venerated as a miracle-worker. He died at the age of 81 in 1968. He was canonized by Pope John Paul II in 2002.
