3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time A - Just as Jesus called his first disciples by name, so he calls us personally and individually. We gather to celebrate the Eucharist because, like them, we want to receive him and to follow him.

First Reading Isaiah 8:23-9:3 - The prophet Isaiah foretells of when the tribes of Israel would be released from the domination of the Assyrians.

Second Reading 1 Corinthians 1:10-13 - St Paul urges the Christians of Corinth not to fall into factions, but to be united in preaching the Good News of Christ crucified.

Gospel Matthew 4:12-23 - St Matthew tells of how Jesus began his ministry with the call to repentance and faith in the closeness of God's kingdom. His first disciples left everything and followed him.

MESSAGE FROM FR. PETER: January seems almost like a little quite quiet break before we move on to February, with the start of our First Holy Communion Course as well as the beginning of Lent. All of our Sacramental Courses are some of the most hugely important gatherings in our parishes, and we are blessed with wonderful catechists, parents and teachers who week in and week out share the faith with our children (as did St. John Bosco, whose Feast is next week, and is patron saint of Young People in our Church). As forms become available for our children to be enrolled, let us pray for all our young people, and continue to strive to make our Churches welcoming places for all our families. We are also blessed to have people making the final preparations to be received into the Church at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday at the end of Lent. Talking of Lent, tickets for the Pancake Gathering are also available, an opportunity for a little get together, a pre-Lent treat and a bit of a laugh. *Why did the waffle not go to the Pancake Party? He was too square*. I'll get my coat...

Wednesday January 25th is the Feast of The Conversion of Saint Paul the Apostle. 'God grant before we die we all, May see the light, as did St. Paul.' That's a quote from the poet John Benjamin, as today we celebrate the Conversion of Saint Paul the Apostle. I'm sure we are all familiar with the story of Saul of Tarsus, who, whilst on the road to Damascus, where he was journeying to persecute Christians, was stopped in his tracks by a blinding flash of light. He heard the words 'Saul, Saul! Why are you persecuting me?' bringing about his conversion, where he became the most fervent of Apostles to the Gentiles. His conversion is recorded throughout the New Testament by Paul himself, and today we marvel at God's wisdom and power in being able to turn around the life of a man who had approved of the killing of Saint Stephen, the first martyr, and who was willing to eventually give up his own life, after diligently and without fear, preaching and teaching the Gospel of Christ, who, he said he called him by name to be an Apostle. "God our Heavenly Father, As today we honour the Conversion of St. Paul, We ask, through his preaching and teaching, And through the intercession of one who bowed his head to your will, That each of us may be filled with a spirit of repentance. That we may turn around our lives so as to live solely for you. We make this prayer through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, One God, for ever and ever. Amen."

Pancake Celebration: well Lent will soon be upon us, but before that we will be holding a **Pancake Evening in the Presbytery at SJ's on Tuesday 20th February, from 6pm - 8pm.** Pancakes will be ready from 6pm, with time to mingle and chit chat, with a quiz, raffle and children's game (the ancient Lancastrian art of Cheese Rolling) from 7pm. Tickets to gauge numbers and cover costs are available after Masses. All welcome.
