

30th Sunday in Ordinary Time: We have come together today to offer worship and prayers, just like the two men in today's Gospel. Let us learn from one of them, the tax collector, the secret of worshipping in a manner that is acceptable to God.

First Reading *Ecclesiasticus 35:12-14, 16-19* The humble person's prayer pierces the clouds.

Second Reading 2 *Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18* Paul comments on his imminent death, trusting that the Lord will "bring me safely to his heavenly kingdom".

Gospel *Luke 18:9-14* A parable: Two believers - a Pharisee and a tax collector - worship at the Temple. At the end of the worship one of them goes home at peace with God, but the other does not.

THE LORD HEARD HIM.

October is the Month of the Holy Rosary. The Sorrowful Mysteries.

- **1.** The Agony in the Garden. And his sweat became as drops of blood running down upon the ground. And rising from prayer he came to the disciples and found them sleeping. (Lk. 22:44-45).
- **2.** The Scourging at the Pillar. Pilate then took Jesus and has him scourged. (Jn. 19:1).
- **3. The Crowning with Thorns.** And they stripped him and put on him a scarlet cloak; and plaiting a crown of thorns they put it on his head and a reed into his right hand. (Mt. 27:28-29).
- **4. The Carrying of the Cross.** And bearing the cross on himself, he went forth to the place called the Skull, in Hebrew, Golgotha. (Jn. 19:17).
- **5. The Crucifixion.** And Jesus cried out with a loud voice and said 'Father, into thy hands I commend My Spirit.' And having said this he gave up his spirit. (Lk. 23:46).
