OFFERTORY ENVELOPES

The new issue of Offertory Envelopes, which come into use on Palm Sunday (10th April) are now available for collection from the sacristy.

If you are unable to collect your envelopes for whatever reason, we will arrange to have them delivered to you.

Traditionally, we had a run of 90 sets of envelopes, with a few gaps here and there which would be filled by new parishioners. In recent years, however, we have lost a good number of our envelope users. There are several reasons for this - many of our long-standing parishioners have sadly died, some people have ceased paying income tax as the Personal Allowance has increased over the years, others have switched to donating by standing order or online banking and some have moved on. As a consequence, this year we have reduced the run of envelopes from 90 to 60 sets, so if your envelope number was previously between 61 and 90 you will now have a new number in the 1 to 60 range.

To enable people who have moved onto standing orders / online giving to Gift Aid their special collections, we now have available some 'mini sets' of envelopes which just contain the purple special collection envelopes. If you would like one of these 'mini sets' please let us know via the parish website, or have a word with Deacon Michael after Mass. **Thank you.**

TASTE AND SEE THAT THE LORD IS GOOD

ST. FRANCIS OF PAOLA, Hermit April 2nd

St. Francis was born about the year 1416, at Paola, a small city in Calabria. His parents were very poor but virtuous. He learned to read in the Franciscan convent at St. Mark's, a town in the same province. After spending a year with the Franciscans, he took up his abode in solitude about half a mile from Paola in 1432.

Before he was twenty, two others joined him to share in his devout exercises. The neighbours built them three cells and a chapel, in which a priest from the parish church said Mass for them. This is looked upon as the beginning of the Order of Minims, the foundation of which is placed in 1436.

In 1482 he went to France by command of Sixtus IV, at the request of Louis XI, whose entire conversion he effected before the latter's death in 1483. When his long life of penance was drawing to a close, St. Francis spent the last three months in his cell to prepare for death and eternity. He fell sick on Palm Sunday, 1508, and died shortly thereafter at ninety-one years of age.
