

Readings for This Sunday: Today celebrate God amongst us in power. Through the Holy Spirit we become not just a group of believers but we are made into Christ's presence in the world, unafraid and empowered to share the message of the Gospel.

1st Reading Acts 2:1-1 -There appeared tongues of fire which rested above them. They were filled with the Holy Spirit and people marvelled that they could understand their words as they spoke about the goodness of God.

2nd Reading 1 Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13 - We have been baptised in the Holy Spirit. It is this Spirit which works in each person to bring about good.

Gospel John 20:19-23 - While they were afraid, Jesus appeared and gave his disciples his peace. He breathed his Spirit on them and sent them out for the forgiveness of sins.

MESSAGE FROM FR. PETER: And so it is that we come to the great Feast of Pentecost, 50 days after Easter, when the Holy Spirit came down upon the Apostles. Before he returned to his Father in Heaven, the risen Jesus visited his disciples and promised to send the Holy Spirit to help them. Today's 1st reading Acts 2:1-11, tells the story of Pentecost Sunday. There were many people in Jerusalem, as Pentecost was a celebration for the end of the grain harvest. When the disciples were gathered together they suddenly heard a noise like a strong wind. Then they saw what looked to be flames of fire over each of them, 'And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit'. The Holy Spirit filled the disciples with courage and faith, empowering them to share the Good News with others. On this day, the gift of the Spirit allowed the disciples to communicate even with those who spoke different languages - and the reading outlines the many different countries from where people had gathered. Over 3,000 people were baptised that day. The Church was born - hence today often being referred to as 'The Birthday of the Church'. If ever I'm asked when the Holy Spirit came down upon the Apostles, I always say 'about 10 to 9 on Pentecost Sunday'. This is because, when the Apostles go out into Jerusalem, people who do not understand them think they are drunk, to which Peter replies 'why, these men are not drunk! It is only 9 o'clock in the morning!' (Acts 2:15), so the Holy Spirit must have come down upon them, just before this. Incidentally, as I said Pentecost marked the end of the grain harvest, and it was tradition that no alcohol was taken before 10 o'clock in the morning on this day, hence the time check. And that's a fact. So enjoy this great celebration - whatever time of the day!

This Thursday 1st June Mass at St. Joseph's will be at 2pm in Honour of the Beginning of the Month of the Sacred Heart. This will be a Healing Mass at which the Sacrament of the Sick will be offered. The Mass will be followed by Tea & Chat in the Hall, and one of the subjects of the 'chat' will be to discuss whether we should make this a monthly event. Helpers would be needed, so if you would like to assist, or have any ideas, please come along.

The Diaconate Ordination of David Pope. There will be a coach to David's ordination on July 8th, picking up at St. Joseph's and St. Peter's, and if you wish to join the coach (around £10) please sign up at the back of Church to gauge numbers. Please sign up this weekend. Please note that there is very little parking at the Cathedral, so the Coach is the best way to travel. The newly Rev. David will lead Rosary, Sermon & Benediction at St. Peter's on Sunday 9th July

at 3pm, followed by strawberry scone & cream tea with refreshments in St. Peter's Hall. (We will gauge numbers nearer the time.) Please keep David in your prayers as he makes his final preparations for his diaconate and appointment as Deacon to St. Joseph's & St. Peter's.
