4th Sunday in Ordinary Time A - Be still before God and wait patiently, for God will appear. Be happy with God, for God will come into your world and satisfy your hunger. Call upon God and God will answer you.

First Reading Zephaniah 2:3; 3:12-13 - The Lord says he will guard and care for the humble.

Second Reading 1 Corinthians 1:26-31 - Paul stresses how the Lord chooses those the world considers to be weak. Gospel Matthew 5:1-12 - The way of God is quite different from our way. He turns the world's values upside down.

MESSAGE FROM FR. PETER: When it was announced that I was coming to St. Joseph's and St. Peter's, a friend of mine from Brentwood Diocese, Fr. Phil, who is a keen bell-ringer and campanologist (which apparently are two separate things), texted me to say that I was the only Catholic Parish Priest in England with two working bell towers. And what a joy it is to hear the sounds of those bells every weekend. And over the past two weeks especially the bells have been wondrously rung. Last week at St. Joseph's a quarter peal of Grandsire Doubles was rung (in F sharp) to celebrate all the work of Richard Jones who is standing down as Tower Captain, having tirelessly organised the renovation and ringing of the bells, as well as training multitudes of people over the years. We thank him for his great ministry over the years, as he hands on his captains rope to James and Stacey Wormleighton. And this weekend at St. Peter's an extra special three hour peal was rung, dedicated to the People of the Parish, only the second time this particular peal has been rung in over one hundred years, led by the president of the Lancashire Association of Change Ringers. (I do hope I've got all the terminology correct here.) Let's ring a huge cheer for all our bell ringers, who remind people in the most glorious way of the presence of our Churches in this world. Grant, O Lord, that the ringing of these bells may be to your honour and glory, and as we, through their music, send out a call to worship, may we also worship you in spirit and in truth; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. And if you would like to join our teams in this important and enjoyable ministry have a word with them on Sunday mornings or pop up on their practise nights: Mon at SP's and Thurs at SJ's. Last time I went up to the bell tower all I saw was a tiny Edam cheese at the top of a rope. It must have been a baby bell. I'll get my coat.

Thursday February 2nd we celebrate 'Candlemas', the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, recalling the day when eight days old, Jesus was brought by his mother Mary and his foster-Father Joseph, to be 'presented' to the Lord, as recorded in chapter two of the Gospel of St. Luke. It was here that the Prophet Simeon proclaimed Jesus as 'The Light of the Gentiles'. It is on this day that we bless the Candles which will be used during our liturgical services throughout the year so that, as the prayer of blessing goes, 'we may reach that light which never fails'. Today marks the end of our 'extended' Christmastide, so if we have kept our cribs on view until today, as we have in Church, it's time to put them away until next year, as we wait a few short weeks until we begin the Season of Lent. We should remember that even at the Presentation of the Lord, the Passion of Christ, which we prepare to celebrate in Lent, is already referred to as Simeon

spoke of Jesus being 'a sign that is destined to be rejected' and how a sword of sorrow would pierce the soul of our Blessed Lady. God our Heavenly Father, True Light and creator of Light, At the Presentation of your Son Jesus, He was proclaimed the Light to the Nations. May we live our lives bathed in his glorious light, And reflect that light to others in our words and deeds, That we may be worthy of being presented to You in Heaven, Through Christ your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, One God, for ever and ever. Amen.
