Monday is the feast of St. Andrew, Apostle & Patron Saint of Scotland - St. Andrew, brother of St. Peter, was a native of the town of Bethsaida in Galilee, and a fisherman by profession. Being first a disciple of St. John the Baptist, he later joined Jesus, and also brought to Him his brother Simon. It is believed he carried the Gospel as far as Russia and Poland, and that he preached at Bysantium. He suffered martyrdom at Patras in Achaia, and according to ancient authorities, by crucifixion on a cross in the form of an X. His relics are in the Cathedral of Amalfi.

PUBLIC MASS: At 12.01am on Wednesday 2nd December the restrictions imposed as a result of the national lockdown will be lifted, and we will return to being in tier 3 (very high alert), as we were before the lockdown. This means churches can open as before, and so we will be able to celebrate public Mass as we were before 5th November. So, our public Masses will be: Sunday 10.30am and Wednesday 9.00am. For this coming week only, there will not be a midday Mass at St Joseph's because there will be a Requiem Mass there - I organised that when I wrongly understood that the lockdown would only end after the Wednesday. As of this week, the church will only be open for private prayer from 10 - 11 am on Saturday.

THE YEAR OF MARK: This Sunday begins the Season of Advent and the beginning of the Church's year. If you use a Sunday missal to follow the Mass, you will need to go to those marked for Year B. In this year the Sunday Gospels tend to be taken from the Gospel of Mark.

Advent is here! It is time to 'get ready'. We miss you all very much and look forward to when we can meet again to pray and share our love for Jesus, the light of the world. Until then look out for these special messages just for you. It is Jesus' birthday soon and there is much to do!

This is the start of a New Year in the Church full of **HOPE** and we will be reading the Gospel of Mark. Today in the Gospel, Jesus tells us to 'stay awake' - now don't actually stay awake or you'll be very, very tired by Christmas day! What does He mean? He means, keep your eyes and your heart open to see God in the world. Wherever there is goodness and love and beauty there is God. A smile, a kind word, a sunrise, a star!

Mary and Joseph travelled to Bethlehem to meet Jesus. The Wise Men followed a star. The Shepherds listened to Angels singing a heavenly song. It's time for us to set off on our journey to the manger to meet the baby Jesus. Jesus sees everything we do for Him. Every prayer, every little act of kindness and He loves us for it.

So let's begin

First of all, make a little Advent prayer space somewhere in your home, maybe even on your bedside table. You will need a little white cloth, a handkerchief will do, and a holy picture or statue and a bible or prayer, just as you like.
