God goes ahead as our Good Shepherd to lead us through his world. Today we listen afresh to his call and pledge ourselves to obey it.

1st Reading Acts 2:14, 36-41 - Peter explains how people who are conscious of their failings can know God's forgiveness and the renewal of the Holy Spirit.

2nd Reading 1 Peter 2:20-25 The way Jesus responded to his persecutors was not only the means of our salvation but also provides us with a model for our own reactions.

Gospel John 10:1-10 - Jesus explains that he is our spiritual leader and therefore worth following and trusting.

MESSAGE FROM FR. PETER. Today, the 4th Sunday of Eastertide, is Good Shepherd Sunday. In the Gospel (John 10:1-10) Jesus tells us that 'The one who enters through the gate is the shepherd of his flock... the sheep hear his voice, and the sheep follow because they know his voice.' We tend to think of the image of the Good Shepherd as gentle and caring, and this is indeed one aspect for this title that Jesus gives himself. But we should remember that at the time of Jesus being a Shepherd in Palestine was not an easy job. Thieves and brigands roamed on the mountainsides, hence the need to guard the sheep twenty-four seven. Similarly the teaching and actions of Jesus, the Good Shepherd, brought Him into danger, leading to his crucifixion, because he cared for us so much. The image of the Good Shepherd is, primarily, one of a loving, caring man, seeking to look after his flock and lead them to the truth. And that is a most wonderful and beautiful image to hold before us. But we should never forget what the Good Shepherd had to endure to share and live out that truth with us. It's also a reminder that living out these teachings ourselves in the world today may bring us into discord with others who disagree or want to water down our faith. And firstly, we have to have listened and recognized the voice of the Good Shepherd in the first place, to have that faith to share. So, did we hear that? *In other news, if I had time I would tell you a convoluted joke about a golf club, a sheep, a stinging insect, a tree, and that scary clown movie... The question is, Wood ewe bee leaf It?* Til get my coat...

This week at St. Peter's we celebrate the First Holy Communion of a group of our children. Please pray for them and their families. The rest of the group will make their first reception of this great Sacrament at St. Joseph's on May 14th Continued thanks to our great team of Sacramental Catechists.

Please make a note in your diary for these celebrations, and keep David in your prayers as he makes his final preparations for his diaconate and appointment as Deacon to St Joseph's and St. Peter's.
