We are reminded today that the kingdom of God brings both great joy and eternal life, but first we must seek to obtain it. **1st Reading 1** *Kings* **3:5, 7-12 -** God bestows on Solomon a wise and shrewd heart. **2nd Reading** *Romans* **8:28-30 -** God intended us to become true images of his Son.

**MESSAGE FROM FATHER PETER:** This Friday we celebrate one of my Patron Saints, the Patron Saint of all priests working in Parishes, Saint John Vianney, the 'Cure d'Ars'. In 1803, at the age of 17, St. John felt God's call in his life to the priesthood. Two years later he began to take formal instruction. He struggled with his studies, however, as he never had the opportunity to go to school growing up. However, his perseverance would pay off. On August 13, 1815, St. John was ordained a priest, and after a brief assignment as an assistant pastor, he was assigned to the small country parish of Ars in 1818. There he built up the Parish, through common sense sermons, and the sacrament of reconciliation. On a typical day, he would hear confessions for 17 hours. He had some difficulties: in particular the devil would appear and try and distract him when he was writing sermons. A few years ago, on a Pilgrimage to the shrines of France, I visited Ars, and you can see the scorch marks of the devil on the desk where he used to sit as St. John composed his sermons. I was also privileged to minister the precious blood from his chalice. On Aug 4, 1859, Fr. Vianney died, having served at Ars for more than 41 years. He was beatified on Jan 8, 1905 and canonized on May 31, 1925 by Pius XI. This is one of St. John Vianney's own prayers: I love You, O my God, and I would rather die loving You, than live without loving You. I love You, O my infinitely lovable God, and I would rather die loving You, than live without loving You. I love You, Lord and the only grace I ask is to love You eternally. My God, if my tongue cannot say in every moment that I love You, I want my heart to repeat it to You as often as I draw breath.
