Bicentenary of the Birth of Elizabeth Prout (Mother Mary Joseph of Jesus CP) 2 September 2020

Elizabeth Prout was born in Shrewsbury on 2 September 1820. The Pilgrimage to her sepulchre in St Anne's church, Sutton planned for 26 September has had to be cancelled on account of the coronavirus. On 2 September, however, Bishop Mark Davies of Shrewsbury Diocese will celebrate Mass in her memory at 12 noon in Shrewsbury Cathedral and this Mass will be livestreamed.

DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE CARE OF CREATION

The day of prayer was established by Pope Francis in order to bring people together to reflect, pray and act for the care of our common home.

"All-powerful God, you are present in the whole universe and in the smallest of your creatures. You embrace with your tenderness all that exists. Pour out upon us the power of your love, that we may protect life and beauty. Fill us with peace, that we may live as brothers and sisters, harming no one."

On the 4th & 5th September we remember St Cuthbert & St. Herbert

St. Cuthbert - Secondary patron of the Diocese. As a monk, Cuthbert travelled widely from coast to coast on long journeys, year after year, to minister to scattered communities and keep alive the spirit of Christianity, and yet he was by nature a solitary person who longed for the life of a hermit which he managed to live eventually on the island of Farne in 676. But in 684 he was called to be a bishop and he devoted himself to preaching and visiting his large diocese. He is remembered as a man who attracted people deeply by the beauty of holiness. His work as a bishop lasted only 2 years and he died on the island of Farne in 687.

St. Herbert - St. Herbert (died 687) was a disciple and friend of St Cuthbert. He lived the life of a hermit on the island in Derwentwater which bears his name. (A Mass is celebrated there in his memory each year.) The witness he gives is the witness to the life of prayer, whose power gives strength to the whole Church and sustains its mission.

GOING INTO HOSPITAL?

How to make a Spiritual Communion

Desire, with earnest longing, to receive our Lord present — Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity — in the Blessed Sacrament. Say this prayer of St. Alphonsus de' Ligouri: "My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Blessed Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire You in my soul. Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. As though You are already there, I embrace You and unite myself wholly to You; do not let me ever be separated from You. Amen".
