#### **Message from Fr. Peter:**

Continued Christmas Greetings! And a very Happy New Year to you all... when it comes! We begin every New Year with the Feast of Mary, Mother of God, putting 2024 under her patronage. 'This celebration, assigned to January 1 in conformity with the ancient liturgy of the city of Rome, is meant to commemorate the part played by Mary in this mystery of salvation. It is meant also to exalt the singular dignity which this mystery brings to the holy Mother ... through whom we were found worthy ... to receive the Author of life". (Marialis cultus - 1974). In the Gospel for this Feast we conclude the stories of Jesus' birth that we have been listening to over the past week as we are told that Mary 'treasured all these things and pondered them in her heart'. These are the words of Pope Saint John Paul II on this Gospel: "The Octave of Christmas ends on the first day of the New Year, which is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin, venerated as the Mother of God. The Gospel reminds us that she "kept all these things, pondering them in her heart". So she did in Bethlehem, on Golgotha at the foot of the cross, and on the day of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit descended in the Upper Room. And so she does today too. The Mother of God and of human beings keeps in her heart all of humanity's problems, great and difficult, and meditates upon them. The Alma Redemptoris Mater walks with us and guides us with motherly tenderness towards the future. Thus she helps humanity cross all the "thresholds" of the years, the centuries, the millenniums, by sustaining their hope in the One who is Lord of history.' Our Lady, Mother of the Holy Family, Wife of Joseph, Queen of Peter and the Apostles pray for us and our Parishes this New Year. Amen.

What a wonderful Christmas we celebrated at St. Joseph's and St. Peter's. Over the festive season we celebrated 4 beautiful masses together, and huge thanks to everyone who made them so special. And huge thanks from me personally to: Michael and David, my friends and deacons; our Altar Serving teams and those who work in our Sacristies; the amazing Organists, Musicians and Choirs (*I tell everyone how blessed I am with the music in my parishes*); The Readers; Ministers (both inside and outside Church); Welcomers; Collectors; Cleaners; Counters; the Flower People and

everyone who decorated our Churches, the Bell Ringers (apparently I am the only Catholic Parish Priest in England with two working towers!); everyone who works in the house, and the grounds; Eileen in the Office; those who look after the buildings (a 'Forth Bridge' job); the refreshment people (on Sundays and First Fridays); and those who Fr. Peter gets to whip up refreshments at various points (usually at the last minute - you know who you are!); St. Peter's SVP and St. Joseph's Care and all those who help with outreach to those in need not least who bring along food and those who distribute it for us; our social event and fund raiser organisers; all those who work with the children - the Catechists, Children's Liturgists, the Teachers, everyone at St. Peter's School, the Parents, and all the children; anyone who should be on this list but isn't (forgive me!); and everyone who comes along to our Parishes and makes them living signs of the Body of Christ in the world today. May the coming year bring us many blessings. Blessings and thanks to you all.
